# 6 Genuine Reason 5 – Animal Welfare

**Note:** This information sheet does not constitute legal advice and is for general information purposes only. Applicants and licensees are required to understand and comply with the *Firearms Act 1996* ("the Act") and associated Regulations, which are available on the Tasmanian legislation website – www.legislation.tas.gov.au. This document was prepared in April 2023 based on the relevant legislation at that time.

A person needs to have a 'genuine reason' to possess or use a firearm to apply for a firearms licence. This information sheet explains how to apply for a firearms licence for the purpose of animal welfare.

# What categories of licence are available for animal welfare?

- Category A and/or Category B licence.
- See Information Sheet 3 Firearms Licence Categories for more detail.

### To obtain a firearms licence for the purpose of animal welfare the applicant must be:

- (a) an officer of the Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals established in Tasmania; or
- (b) a veterinary surgeon registered under the Veterinary Surgeons Act 1987; or
- (c) an inspector under the Animal Health Act 1995; or
- (d) an inspector or officer under the Animal Welfare Act 1993; or
- (e) an authorised person under the *Dog Control Act 2000*; or
- (f) an authorised officer under the *Nature Conservation Act 2002*; or
- (g) a primary producer; or
- (h) a prescribed person.



## What documents are required to apply for a firearms licence for the purpose of animal welfare?

#### Category A:

Evidence that the applicant has a genuine reason for possessing or using a firearm for the purpose of animal welfare is required. Firearms Services requests that this evidence is provided in the form of a letter from the applicant's employer or affidavit/statutory declaration from the applicant if appropriate (for example, if the applicant is a primary producer). Relevant information is likely to include:

- information in relation to the applicant's employment or occupation;
- the applicant's role and professional duties; and
- why the applicant's duties require the use of a firearm.

#### Category B:

#### All Category A documents plus:

evidence to the Commissioner of Police's satisfaction that there is a need for the person to possess or use a firearm of the category to which the application relates.

#### **Important note:**

A licence or permit from the Department of Natural Resources and Environment is usually **also** required for activities involving shooting animals. Check their website and contact the department for more information https://nre.tas.gov.au/.
