A person may attend any approved rifle club, pistol shooting club or range and upon completing an application, participate in one shooting activity on one day at that club or range.

How the one day club/range exemption works

A one day club exemption allows a person to possess or use, at a club or range, a firearm approved for use at that club or range for the purpose of participating in one shooting activity on one day at that club or range.

An applicant for a one day exemption must:

- be at least 18 years of age;
- not be subject to any order that would prevent them from lawfully possessing and/or using a firearm; and
- participate in a briefing on firearms safety and handling, and relevant range/club rules prior to participating in a shooting activity.

Can a person be refused a one day exemption?

Yes. All approved clubs and ranges are required to submit their register of one day exemption applications to Firearms Services for review. If a patron is assessed as being unfit to be granted any further exemptions, the person and club/range will be advised by Firearms Services and the person will not be allowed to participate in any future shooting activities.

Can a person participate in multiple shooting activities?

Yes, a person may participate in multiple shooting activities at a club or range but they must be on different days. They will need to complete the application process each time.
